Maxwell students completed Lions Quest's *Skills for Adolescence* curriculum with their teacher, Deepa Sudhakaran, who took advantage of the program's professional development workshop to become a more effective educator. Her endeavor worked. "I interact with everyone and now don't fear talking with anyone," said her student Abhay. Young Parinitha shared, "I learned boys and girls have equal rights and opportunities."
